Some nouns are countable (nouns we can count), and some nouns are uncountable (nouns we can't count or are not easy to count).

Countable nouns can be singular or plural.

Singular	Plural
bank	bank <b>s</b>
box	box <b>es</b>
orange	orange <b>s</b>
story	stor <b>ies</b>

- ◆ There is a **bank** near my house.
- ◆ There are two **banks** near her house.

#### **Special Notes:**

We need to put **a**, **an**, or **the** before a singular countable noun.

Uncountable nouns are always singular, and we don't need to put a, an, or a number before it.
