Learn about It

Possessives are adjectives, pronouns, forms of words that are used to show ownership or relationship.

We use **"possessive adjectives"** with nouns.

- ◆ They are **my** clothes.
- ◆ It is **her** money.
- ◆ It is **their** toy.

We use **"possessive pronouns"** without nouns.

- ◆ These clothes are **mine**.
- ◆ The money is **hers**.
- ◆ The toy is **theirs**.

★ Please see the **appendix on page 51** for other examples of possessive pronouns.

We can use **"noun + 's"** without another noun.

- ◆ The car is **Peter's/my brother's**. = It is Peter's car/my brother's car.

We use **whose** to ask about ownership.

- ◆ A: **Whose** book is this?
B: It's mine.
- ◆ A: **Whose** books are these?
B: They're Eric's.

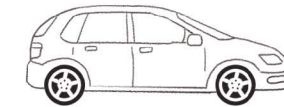
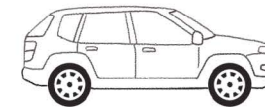

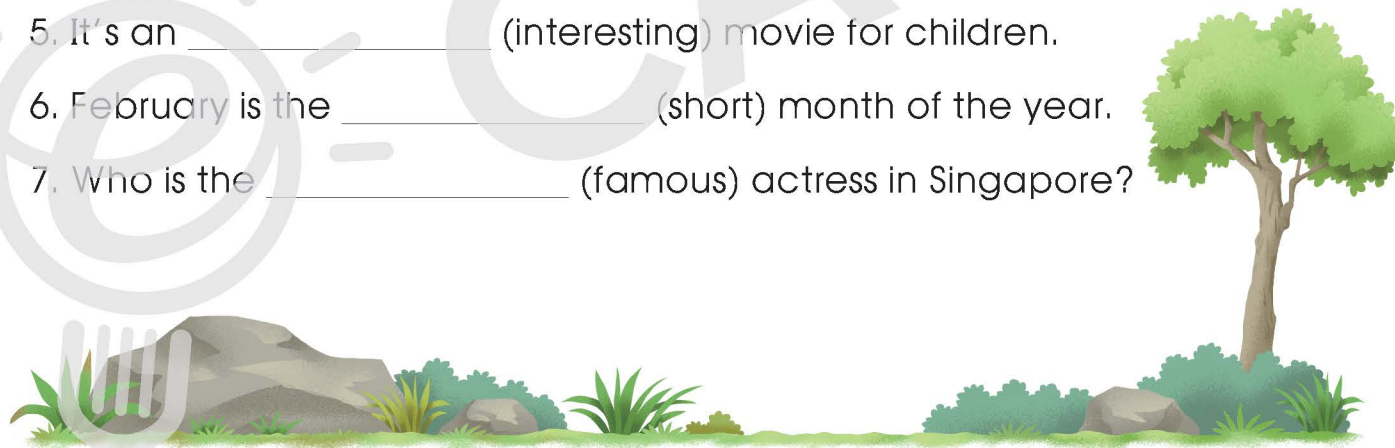
